SHELTER ITEMS CHECKLIST

FOR SPECIAL NEEDS RESIDENTS

Before an emergency threatens the state, have a plan in place. Preregistration for a spot in a special needs shelter is important and strongly encouraged to make sure necessary resources are available. Go to FloridaDisaster.org/Shelters for special needs registration by county.

If you are a caregiver, you should accompany the special needs client. Bring enough items to last at least five days for both you and the client. Use this checklist to prepare for your stay.
