Vaccines help keep you healthy.

By skipping vaccinations, you put yourself at risk for diseases such as shingles, pneumococcal disease, flu, and HPV and hepatitis B—both leading causes of cancer.

Vaccines are as important to your overall health as diet and exercise.

Vaccines are essential for maintaining your health, just like a nutritious diet, frequent exercise, and routine checkups. Vaccines are one of the safest preventive care measures available.

Vaccines are safe and can mean the difference between life and death.

Babies are born with immune systems that can fight most germs, but some germs cause serious or even deadly diseases a baby can't handle. Vaccines use very small amounts of antigens to help your child's immune system recognize and learn to fight serious diseases.

FLORIDA IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

CHILDCARE AND/OR FAMILY DAYCARE

- Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (DTaP)
- Polio (IPV)
- Measles-Mumps-Rubella (MMR)
- Varicella
- Haemophilus Influenzae Type B (Hib)
- Pneumococcal Conjugate (PCV13)
- Hepatitis B (Hep B)

PRESCHOOL ENTRY

- Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (DTaP)
- Polio (IPV)

- Hepatitis B (Hep B)

- Haemophilus Influenzae Type B (Hib)

KINDERGARTEN THROUGH 12TH GRADE

Before entering or attending school in-person or virtually (kindergarten through 12th grade) each child must provide a Florida Certification of Immunization (DH 680 form), documenting the following immunizations:

- Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (DTaP)
- Polio (IPV)
- Measles-Mumps-Rubella (MMR)
- Hepatitis B (Hep B)
- Varicella

In addition to kindergarten through 12th grade vaccines, students entering or attending 7th grade must have a **Tetanus-Diphtheria-Pertussis (Tdap)** vaccine.
