


COVID-19 Booster Shots

A booster shot is administered to increase the immune response of people who have completed the recommended number of initial doses for a COVID-19 vaccine.

WHO CAN GET A COVID-19 BOOSTER SHOT?





You can choose the Pfizer, Moderna, or J&J COVID-19 vaccine for your booster shot regardless of which vaccine you initially received.

People should talk to their health care provider about whether a booster shot is appropriate for them.

A booster shot will increase your immune response.

YOU CAN GET THE PFIZER, MODERNA, OR THE J&J
COVID-19 VACCINE BOOSTER SHOT IF:

You received 2 doses of the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine over 6 months ago and



You're age 65 and older.

Or you're age 18 and older, and you:

- · Live in a long-term care setting,
- · Have an underlying medical condition, or
- You work and/or live in a high-risk setting.

OR

You're age 18 and older and you received the J&J vaccine over 2 months ago.



You can choose the Pfizer, Moderna, or J&J COVID-19 vaccine for your booster shot regardless of which vaccine you initially received.

People should talk to their health care provider about whether a booster shot is appropriate for them.





COVID-19 Vaccine Additional Dose

An additional dose is administered to improve moderately to severely immunocompromised people's immune response to their initial two-dose series of the Pfizer or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine.

Who can get an additional dose of the Pfizer and Moderna COVID-19 vaccine?







You should use the same COVID-19 vaccine (Pfizer or Moderna) that you received initially for your additional dose. Unlike a COVID-19 booster shot, the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines are not interchangeable for an additional dose.

People should talk to their health care provider about whether a booster shot is appropriate for them.

At this time, an additional dose is not recommended for people who received the J&J COVID-19 vaccine.

YOU CAN GET AN ADDITIONAL DOSE OF THE PFIZER OR MODERNA COVID-19 VACCINE IF:

You received 2 doses of the Pfizer vaccine over 28 days ago and



You're moderately or severely immunocompromised*,

And you're age 12 and older.

OR



You're moderately or severely immunocompromised*,

And you're age 18 and older.



You should use the same COVID-19 vaccine (Pfizer or Moderna) that you received initially for your additional dose. Unlike a COVID-19 booster shot, the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines are not interchangeable for an additional dose.

People should talk to their health care provider about whether a booster shot is appropriate for them.
