







6 MONTHS

Responds to own name.

Mimics sounds.

Likes to play with others, especially parents.

12 MONTHS (1 YEAR)

Uses simple gestures: shaking head "no" or waving "bye-bye."

Says "mama" and "dada" & phrases like "uh-oh!"

Responds to simple spoken requests.

18 MONTHS (1½ YEARS)

Plays simple pretend, like feeding a doll.

Points to show others something interesting.

Shows a full range of emotions: happy, sad, angry.

24 MONTHS (2 YEARS)

Says sentences with 2–4 words.

Gets excited with other children.

Points to things or pictures when they are named.

36 MONTHS (3 YEARS)

Shows affection for friends without prompting.

Carries on a conversation using 2–3 sentences.

Plays make-believe with dolls, animals & people.
