PUBLIC SAFETY ALERT: FENTANYL KILLS

The State of Florida is responding to an increase in **fentanyl overdoses**. All Floridians are advised to remain vigilant of current public risk.

SIGNS OF OVERDOSE

- Small, constricted "pinpoint pupils."
- Falling asleep or losing consciousness.
- Slow, weak, or not breathing.
- Choking or gurgling sounds.
- Cold and/or clammy skin.
- Discolored skin, especially lips and nails.
- Limp body.

WHAT TO DO

- 1. Call 911 Immediately.
- 2. Administer naloxone, if available.
- 3. Try to keep the person awake and breathing.
- 4. Lay the person on their side to prevent choking.
- 5. Stay with the person until emergency assistance arrives.
